application which was reviewed by Indiana-based Healthiest Employers LLC. Companies were scored in six categories: Leadership commitment, communication and markets, foundational components, programming and interventions, strategic planning, and reporting and analysis. This week's print edition will include a detailed look at how Healthiest Employers developed its survey and how companies are scored.

The awards are broken down by company size to make apples-to-apples comparisons. The reason is simple: The larger a company is, the more resources it should have to put toward an employee wellness program.
